

Cobblestone Tour

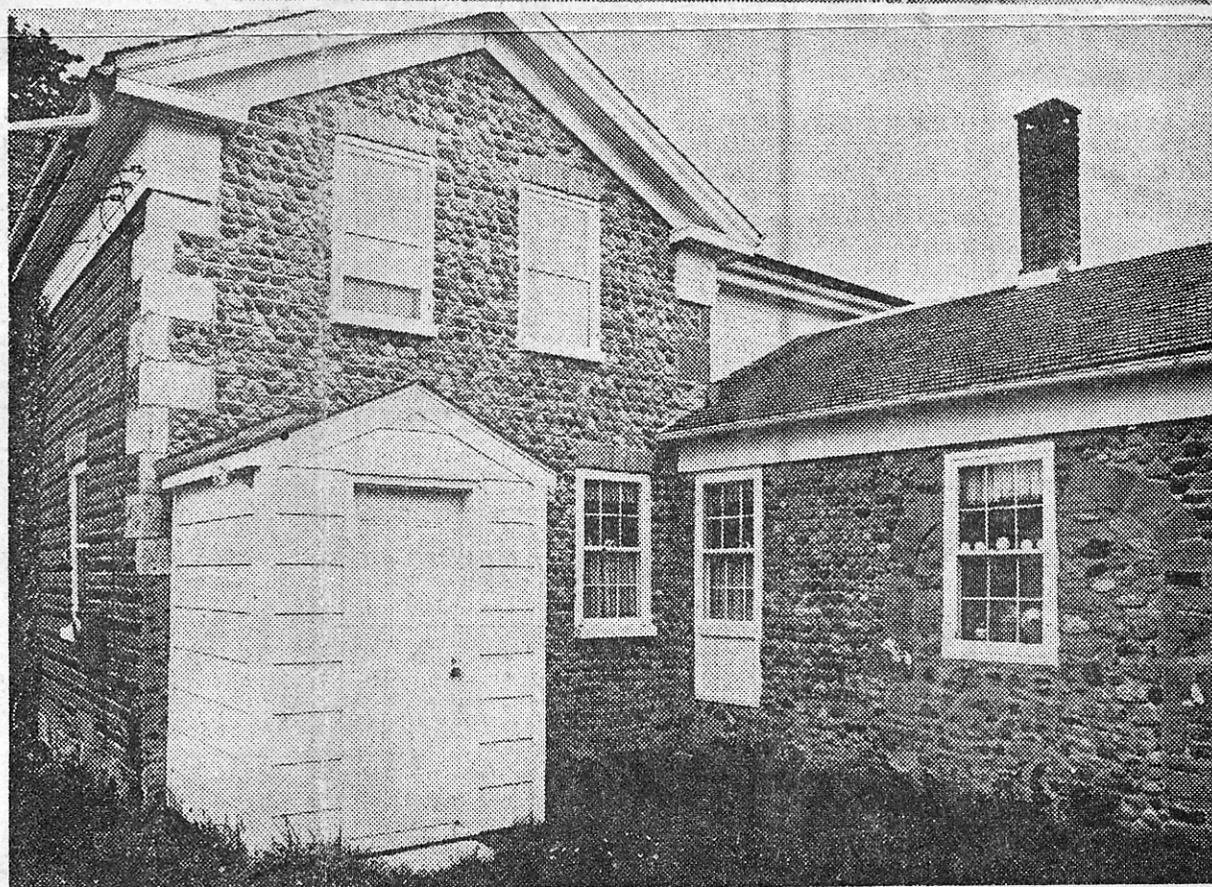
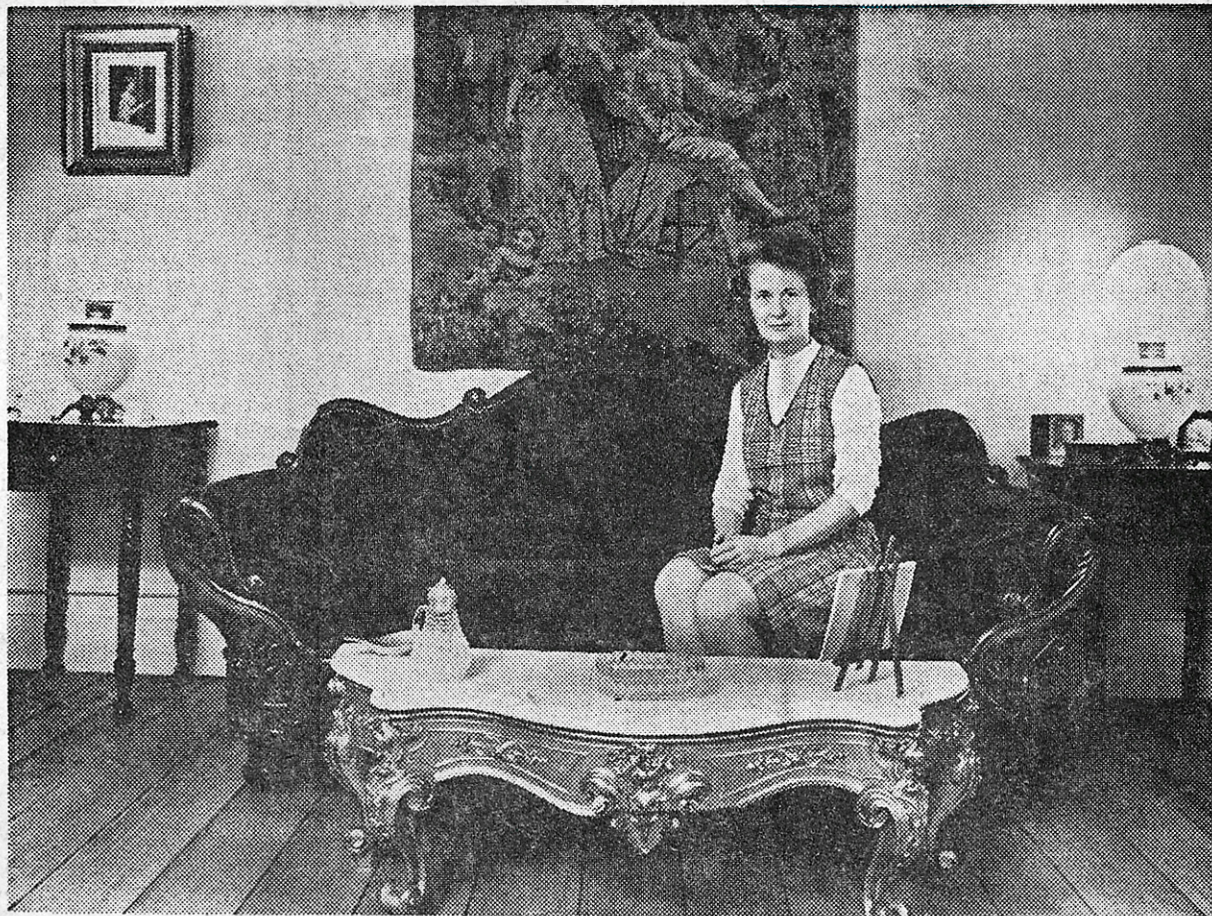
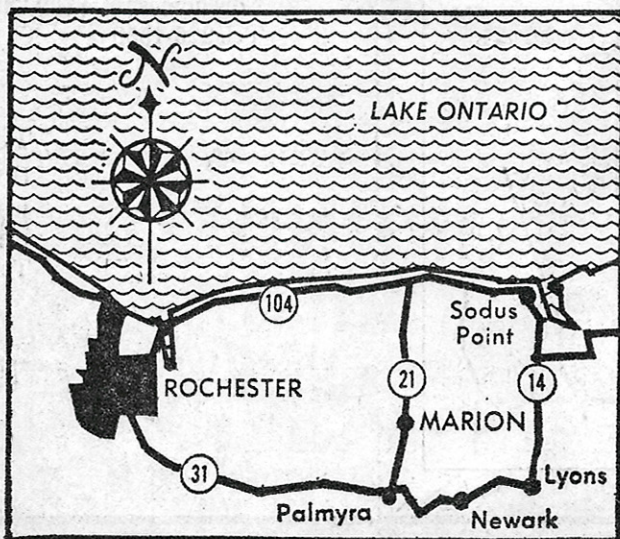
If you've been driving near Marion lately, you may have noticed considerable activity in the area's cobblestone houses—more than the usual spring cleaning flurry.

The reason: Next Saturday, nine of the houses will be on the Tenth Annual Cobblestone Tour.

It's designed as a self-guided tour. Drop by the Marion Town Hall after 11 a.m., pay \$2 per person, and pick up your tickets and self-guiding booklet, complete with a map and details of each structure. The houses will be open from 1-5 p.m.

One home on the tour is the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Huber on Dormedy Hill Road. Built in 1849, it's one of the newest homes on the tour. It also has the most distinctive herringbone pattern on the outside walls. The Hubers, who have lived there since 1961, have furnished it entirely with antiques picked up from dealers or at auctions and shows. The floors are all original and, except for one bedroom, all chestnut.

Marion is in Wayne County, about seven miles north of Palmyra on Route 21. From Rochester, you can take either Penfield Road (Route 441) east to Marion, or Route 31 east to Palmyra and Route 21 north to Marion.
