COBBLESTONE ARCHITECTURE, Town of Junius, Seneca County, N.Y.

HOUSE

1. County road 106, east side, just north of Thruway. Owned and occupied by John Adler, Waterloo, R.D.3. Undated, owner thinks early 1830's.

HOUSE

2. County road 106, (Birdsey road) east side, north of Larsen road, presently unoccupied. Waterloo R.D.2. Paine Estate. Owned, I believe, by Mrs. Edith Richmond, R.D.3 Wellsville, N. Y, daughter of the last occupants, Mr. & Mrs. George Paine.

HOUSE

3. Corner of County road 106, (Birdsey road) and Bedell road. Owned and occupied by Mr. Ernest Kunes. Waterloo, R.D.2. Part cobblestone.

HOUSE

4. Odell road. North side. Owned ~~and occupied~~ by Elmer Schendel. Waterloo R.D.2

HOG SHED

5. Garrett road. East side. Small ~~barn~~ ^{HOG} shed. Poor condition, On farm of Percy Lundy. Waterloo R.D.2. Fieldstone, ~~not~~ ^{AND} true cobblestone.

RUIN OF HOUSE

6. Burned and gutted house. Some walls standing. On lane between county road 107 and Wheeler road. (West side of 107, north of the Junius Presbyterian church which is at the corner of 106 & 107. Owned by a ~~Mr. Lasher~~ ^{GORDON MILLS}?

HOUSE

7. County road 109. South side, east of 108. In the hamlet of Dublin, (Junius) Residence of William Noone. Owned by Mrs. Hazel Fisk ? Both addresses- Clyde R.D.2.

HOUSE

8. County road 109. North side, west of Lasher road. Owned and occupied by Steven Smith. Clyde R.D.2.

HOUSE

9. Stone church road. East side. North of Story road. Owned and occupied by Theodore Grillone. Waterloo R.D.2.

HOUSE

10. Stone church road. East Side. South of Story road. Owned and occupied by Howard Holmes. Waterloo R.D.2.

CHURCH 1839

11. Old State road. West side. Near junction of Stone Church road ~~and~~ at Junius Corners. Methodist Episcopal Church. Dated 1839.

HOUSE

12. Old State road. South side. East of Stone Church road. Occupied by Carl Wildner. (Owner ?) Waterloo, R.D.3

SMOKEHOUSE

13. Southeast corner of Avery road and County road 109. Cobblestone, ~~or~~ fieldstone, and brick, smokehouse ~~or~~ ^{or} ~~brick~~. In rear of residence of D. W. Mulcahy. (owner?) Lyons R.D.1.

COBBLESTONE ARCHITECTURE, Town of Tyre, Seneca County, N. Y.

1. Southwest corner of route 414 and 318 (Old State road) at Magee. Residence of Robert Strong (owner) Seneca Falls, R.D.1. Part cobblestone.
- HOUSE
2. Southeast corner of Mays Point road and Lay road. Owned and occupied by Kenneth Rogers. Seneca Falls, R.D.1.
- BARN 1859
3. North side of Lay road. Opposite residence of Kenneth Rogers. Owned by him, I believe. Small barn, dated 1859.
- HOUSE
4. West side of county road 101, (Gravel road) north of 318, (Old State road) and south of Nearpass road. Residence of Edward Adler, Seneca Falls, R.D.1. Owner?
- SCHOOL HOUSE
5. North side of lane opposite Durling road, west of county road 101. Former schoolhouse, now a private residence. Stuccoed and painted. Concrete block addition. Did not fully check out this building.

Town of Waterloo

There are no cobblestone buildings in the town of Waterloo, neither are there any in the village of Waterloo, which is partly in the town of Waterloo and partly in the town of Fayette.

Town of Seneca Falls

There are no cobblestone buildings in the village of Seneca Falls, which is entirely within the town of Seneca Falls. Outside of the village, there is but one cobblestone building in the town.

HOUSE

1. West side of Lower Lake road, (county road 116), north of Cayuga Lake State Park. Residence of Carl Caulkins, (& owner). Seneca Falls R.D.2. See page 134 of "The Underground" by Arch Merrill. Station on the Underground Railroad, etc. State Historical Marker along road.

NEAR EISENHOWER COLLEGE

Town of Fayette.

HOUSE

1. Southeast corner of Ritter road and Aunkst road. Owned and occupied by James Ridley. R.D.1, Waterloo. Dated 1843 sez I, 1813 sez owner!
- HOUSE
2. West side Post road just south of Larsen road. Owned and occupied by Wilbur Freier. R.D.3, Geneva. Part cobblestone.

Town of Varick.

HOUSE

1. West side route 89, south of county road 124, north of East Varick. Summer home of Frank B. Martin. Romulus R. D. Dated 1833. Mr. Martin's winter residence is in New Jersey.

RUIN OF GRIST MILL

2. Ruins of an old grist mill, in woods along Reeder's Creek. South of County road 127, east of County road 125 (East Lake Road) On farm owned by Howard Reeder, Romulus R.D.1. Fieldstone, ~~not~~ cobblestone.

3. Part cobblestone small building, attached to house, and presently used as a garage. Possibly walls or foundations of an earlier, larger building. South side Willers road on short lane. Residence of ? (Boyle Acres)". Romulus R. D.
