
Historic Cobblestone, known as the "Isaac Allen" home. Built in the early 1800's with the large South wing added in the later part of the 1800's.

This home features many original amenities, such as door latches, pine flooring, wainscoting and a unique Grandfathers clock built into the living room wall.

When including the finished attic the home has 12 large rooms with aprox. 2,900 sq. ft. of living space. This does include a one bedroom upper apartment, that could be easily turned back into a single family home.

There are 3 full baths, first floor laundry, 2 fireplaces and a full walk-out basement. The property also includes 3 large barns, shed, stone smoke house and fireplace(barbecue) and wishing well. All of this is situated on aprox. 40 acres with Sandy Creek running through the property.

LIVING ROOM: 14 x 17.1 Fire place, antique white molding, Dark blue colonial striped wallpaper. Navy carpeting (pine floors under carpet) Closet and wood closet. East door

leads to large porch. 1800's Grandfather clock built in the wall.

DEN OR BEDROOM: 8 x 16.10 Antique white walls with colonial green trim, pine flooring and French doors.

FORMAL PARLOR OR BEDROOM: 15.8 x 17.2 White ornate molding, floral wallpaper, built in cabinet. Fire place with ornate mantle. (not presently used).

BATH: Full bath Dark gray and white. Large walk-in closet off bath.

2nd FLOOR OF COBBLESTONE: Original wooden stairway.

3 rooms, Antique white walls with pine trim, Large closet, shelving and attic storage.

BASEMENT: walkout full basement, cement flooring and brick.

WATERFRONT: On Sandy Creek. The creek is aprox. 16 feet  
wide and has a depth of aprox. 3-7 feet. The area of land  
surrounding the creek is a sanctuary for many kinds of birds  
and wildlife for example some that have been seen are deer,  
beaver, muskrats, Great horned owls and even a bald eagle  
has been spotted.
