

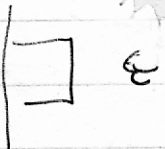
History of Clarendon 1810-1888 by David Stungis Copeland pub 1889

1888 sold 22,000 bushels of lime
burned lime all winter
\$20 per bushel at the kiln
\$25 " " when delivered.

S This view of the south side of the kiln shows a small square
metal plate, ^{approx 2/3 of the way down the side of the kiln} The metal plate is attached to the metal rod
seen at the top of this picture which runs through the shelf of
the kiln acting as a support.

The first view of the kiln shows that the stone shell of the kiln was laid
up without mortar.

Murphy's lime kiln

③ Firebrick laid up before the Civil War by Isaac Phillips
Small patches of air mortar between a few of the bricks.

a close up of debris in the
waste pile across the pathway in front of the kiln
The pile contains ~~partially~~ burnt pieces of limestone
& partially slaked lime.
