

4- THE MACLEOD VICTORIAN HOUSE ON GANSZ ROAD

This Victorian house owned by the MacLeods on Gansz Road is the only truly Victorian cobblestone house found in Wayne County. The woodwork is done in beautiful walnut. There are lovely sliding doors and a semi-circular stairway which is said to have cost \$1,500 alone. The attic is larger than many modern homes.

STONES: The fieldstones are red, gray, and yellow that are 3-4 x 2-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Each run is 3 to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches high.

JOINTS: The horizontal joint is a prominent V.

MORTAR: The mortar is hard and gray with a fine texture.

QUOINS: The quoins are regular, tooled limestone.

LINTELS: The lintels are wooden.

SIDES: On the sides and back there are three runs per quoin instead of four.

Of the many, many homes I covered, there was only one of the Victorian style - - the MacLeod's on Ganz Road. The woodwork is done in beautiful black walnut. There are lovely sliding doors, and a semi-circular stairway which is said to have cost \$1,500. The attic itself is larger than many modern houses.
