

JOHN WAKE PLACE, MARION
10.— Peter Boerman

The John Wake place now owned by Peter Boerman is located on the Dean Road. The mason is thought to have been a Captain Lacey and Henry Butler is said to have supervised the work. It will be noted the windows in the living room are lower than the others. This was done to please Mrs. Nasmith, daughter of John Wake, who as a child thought the house was too dark.

STONES: Small red lake stones on the front measuring $2\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$.

There are a few patches of stones laid in herringbone fashion. The lower three-quarters of the sides have only black and gray stones but the upper is red lake stones. Stones at the back are laid flush with the mortar.

JOINTS: Horizontal is a V and the vertical are V's and pyramids.

MORTAR: The mortar is rough and light colored.

QUOINS: The quoins measure about 18 x 9 x 5. The part that would ordinarily be tooled is instead rounded.

LINTELS: The lintels are both lime and sandstone.
