

5. - HARVEY THOMPSON HOUSE, CORNER OF COLE  
AND THE PALMYRA-MARION ROAD

Located on the Palmyra-Marion Road, this house is now owned by Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Thompson was formerly the home of her parents, the Shaws, and was known as the Anthony Shaw House. The house was built by Job Durfee.

STONES: At the front of the house the stones are red lake stones mostly diagonally laid that measure  $1\frac{1}{2}$ -2 x  $\frac{3}{4}$  inches. There are six  $2-2\frac{1}{4}$  in. courses per quoin.

JOINTS: The horizontal joint is a  $\frac{5}{8}$  inch V and the vertical joints are mostly pyramids with some V's.

MORTAR: The mortar is reddish, has no pebbles, and is fine in texture.

LINTELS and QUOINS: The quoins and lintels are regular, tooled limestone blocks.

NORTH SIDE: On the north side the arrangement is in herring-bone style. These stones are generally  $4-4\frac{1}{2}$  inches high and  $1-1\frac{1}{4}$  in. wide, laid at about a 50 degree angle to fit in a 3-4 in. course.

SOUTH SIDE: The stones are red lake with some black and whites measuring  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $1\frac{1}{2}$  in., five courses per quoin.

BACK: There are mostly field stones of all colors measuring 4-5 x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ -3 inches in the back.
