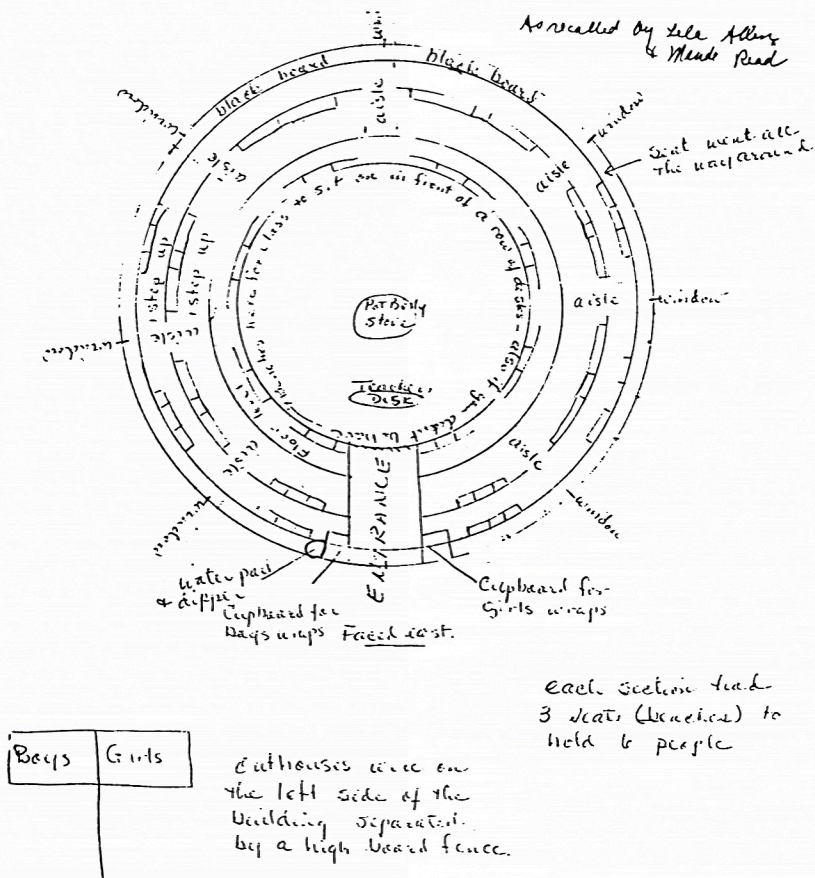


The new shed was painted which was a change from the old wood-colored one. I wasn't painted; I remained just a plain weathered door. For many years, the interior woodwork was painted pink.

 Burned in 1920 — when stone blew up Albany would not let
 them rebuild.
 Sometime between 1838 + 1920 it was remodeled and the seats
 were all put on one level.
