

2.- LEON C. FRANTZ HOUSE, ROSE-RESORT ROAD

Leon C. Frantz owns this house on the Rose- Resort Road in the township of Rose. The mason received \$.75 a day. The barn is thought to have been built at the same time as the house. The wood work in the house is pine and in three rooms were beautifully designed plaster of Paris ceilings. Every window in the house is the same size. One beam is about thirty feet long and a foot square.

STONES: The stones are all colored, various shaped, lake washed. They measure $2-3\frac{1}{2}$ x $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches. There are four or five courses of $3\frac{1}{4}$ -4 inches per quoin.

JOINTS: The $\frac{3}{4}$ inch horizontal V is very well preserved. The vertical joints are V's and pyramids.

MORTAR: The mortar is very hard, of fine texture, and brownish in color.

QUOINS: The quoins are of tooled sandstone.

LINTELS: The lintels are wooden.

SIDES and BACK: The stones at the sides and back are larger all colored field stones.
