William Desmond, William Mitchell connection

"On the north side, some rods back from the street, is a very pretty cobble-stone house, the very first met on this road. Here, till recently, dwelt Jared Chaddock and family. The earliest resident whom I can find was William Desmond. He was born in Ireland, an uncle of the William Desmond residing east of the Valley ... his marriage to Lucinda Winchell. Her brother-in-law, Esquire Mitchell, married them and she bore nine children to him. He died in 1849, aged forty-two years. ... To him succeeded **William Mitchell to whom we owe the stone house. He was the second son of Philander**, long known as "Squire Mitchell" ... He married Jane Grenell ... and now lives in Lyons."

"... Only a few weeks since the farm passed into the hands of Miss Lucinda Mitchell, and Jared has moved to the Valley (now owned by Cornelius Marsh, who has rebuilt the barns and house making them very attractive.)"

NOTE: William Desmond (nephew) east of the Valley is the guy who "accumulated" cobblestone houses as they became available (re— Ros-3: 11273 Mauder Rd and Ros-4: 3833 Shepard Rd)

Epilogue

In 2014 I wrote an article for the Rose Historical Society Newsletter: Town of Rose Cobblestone Buildings. I enumerated nine cobblestone buildings erected during the middle period era. Two of them remained at that time (and still do in 2022). This was one of the buildings. I concluded by inviting input from those in the community who may have more information about any of the buildings.

Confirmation received: Ken Weiss, Rose Town historian 2014, responded to me on 6/5/2014: "Henry Dunphy called me today. He remembered that a house on Wayne Center Rose Road between Covell Rd and Lovers Lane (now an Amish farm) is a cobblestone house that had siding put on over the cobblestones by the previous owner because one corner needed repair. "
