... ELISHA MERRIMAN HOUSE

The Merriman house stood on Vine Street, just north of the train tracks at the northwest edge of the Village of Liverpool. The house shows on the 1852 county map as belonging to Mars Nearing, but by 1859, Nearing and his family had moved to Hastings, NY and Elisha Merriman had taken over the farm. It is not known when the wood frame house was built, but it is likely that the cobblestone wing was added by Merriman in the mid 1850s. The 1865 census shows Elisha Merriman, 52, living there with his wife, Polly, 51, a daughter, Josephine, 25, a son, Willis L., 21 and a nephew, Willis S., 14. Polly was Elisha's second wife, his first wife having died of Consumption (Tuberculosis) in 1844. The family farmed the adjacent 106 acres of land. In 1870, the farm had 3 horses, 2 "milch cows", 1 pig, 199 sheep and 6 other cattle. They produced wheat, corn, oats, and tobacco. Their biggest crops in 1870 were tobacco, producing 4200 pounds, and the wool from 199 sheep.

Just after World War II, in 1946-48, General Electric built a 150 acre plant called Electronics Park. The land from the old Merriman farm became a large part of this complex. The Merriman house was torn down to build the Vine Street entrance to Electronics Park. No photographs of the house are known."
