

## 16.- WALLINGTON SCHOOL HOUSE

The old Wallington School House on the North Geneva Road is now used as a community center. Unfortunately, the foundation was very poor. Woodchucks have even managed to burrow under it. This has resulted in very bad bulging out of the wall of the back. It has been shored up with concrete.

STONES: The field stones measure  $2\frac{1}{2}$ -4 x  $2$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches.

JOINTS: The horizontal joint is  $\frac{3}{4}$  to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch high.

The vertical joints are V's and pyramids.

MORTAR: The mortar is hard with many lime clumps.

QUOINS: The quoins are irregular sandstone.

LINTELS: The lintels are wooden.
