

26.-PULVER HOUSE IN SODUS

William G. Pulver has owned this house on Maple Avenue in Sodus for fourteen years. He bought it from Mary Royce who lived there for eighty years and whose parents lived there for some years. There is an attraction in front in the stones where every sixth stone row is white.

STONES: The red and white lake stones are $1\frac{1}{4}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$ x $1\frac{1}{4}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$ in.
Courses are $2\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{3}{4}$ inches.

JOINTS: The horizontal V is $\frac{3}{4}$ inches. The vertical joints are V's and pyramids.

MORTAR: The hard mortar is brown and fine.

QUOINS: The quoins are regular, dashed sandstone.

LINTELS: The lintels are vertically laid sandstones.

SIDES: The stones on the sides are larger, red, white, and black stones.
