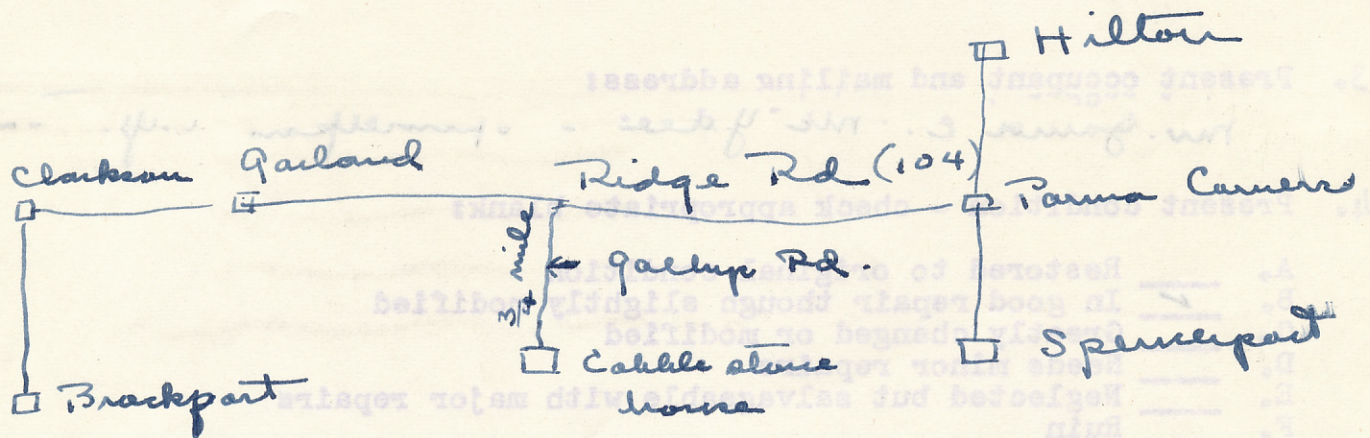

That was built by my Great-grandfather Eli Gallup around 1840. We are told that it took two years to collect the stones from Lake Ontario, with which to build the house. It is stated in the Gallup genealogy that when Eli Gallup came to these parts, there were only twelve houses in Rochester. I doubt that, as statistics show that Rochester was more thickly populated at that time. Eli Gallup built a log house in an apple orchard near the present house and my grandfather George Gallup was born there in 1833. When he was seven years old, he planted a nut from which

a very large black <sup>tree</sup> walnut, grew  
 and it is still standing. Several  
 limbs have been blown off and  
 around 1918, my father Charles H.  
 Gallup had ~~three~~ <sup>three</sup> good sized chairs  
 made from one limb. My Grand-  
 father died in 1925 at the age of  
 92 and my father died in 1942.
