

9.- COBBLESTONE GAS STATION, WILLIAMSON

Although this former doctors home in midtown Williamson has been converted into a gas station much of its charm has not been marred. The fine old entrance was not changed during the renovation and the upper half story with the beautiful old grills and oval fans remain. The house was built by a Mr. Bennett about 1838. It has been owned for three years by the Texas Company.

STONES: The regular red lake stones measure $1\frac{1}{2}$ - $3\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

JOINTS: The horizontal joint is a V and the vertical joints are pyramids.

MORTAR: The mortar is hard, light colored, and fine textured.

QUOINS: The quoins are tooled limestone that measure 18 x 12 x $6\frac{1}{4}$.

LINTELS: The lintels are wooden.

SIDE : Larger stones are at the sides.

BACK : Larger lake and field stones are at the back.
