Cobblestone Tour of Homes Returns-Saturday, September 30th

The Cobblestone Society is pleased to announce the return of ing ticket holders to tour the interior of their homes. This bethe Cobblestone Tour of Homes, planned this year for Saturday, September 30th from 11am-4pm. This annual tradition flourished for over 30 years and was a mainstay on the Cobblestone Society's calendar of events.

Event planners are lining up about 8 stops on this year's selfdrive tour that features cobblestone homes and buildings around Orleans County. Cobblestone architecture flourished from about 1820 until the end of the Civil War and over 900 structures were built in New York State during that time. Orleans County can proudly boast 100 of that number. The emphasis of the Cobblestone Home Tour is a focus on cobblestone masonry and its many forms of expression. Owners of several of the homes featured in the tour are graciously allow-

hind-the-scene glimpse of home interiors is a favorite of previous attendees and will certainly be a highlight of this tour, too.

Those taking part in the tour are invited to set their own pace and visit sites throughout the day. A map and tour booklet containing historical information on each of the cobblestone buildings will be distributed to ticket holders. Tickets for the Cobblestone Tour of Homes are available at the Cobblestone Society, 14389 Ridge Road West, Albion, or online at cobblestonemuseum.org. Ticket prices are \$15 for Cobblestone Society Members and \$20 for non-members. A special "twofor" ticket option would cover two people at a cost of \$25 for members and \$35 for non-members. Cobble the Mouse Finger Puppets: Designer in the Spotlight



It's time to reveal the creative talent behind our adorable Cobble finger puppets, developed last season to accompany the launch of the *Cobble the Museum Mouse* coloring and story book. Albion resident Shirley Farone was approached by Trustee Grace Kent to design the 3-inch felt finger puppets to represent the Cobblestone Museum's mascot. Each handmade mouse is sewn with at-

tention to detail, including its rosy pink nose and inner ears.

Shirley has engaged in craft activities since she was a 4-year-old, crediting relaxation and pleasure as her motivation to stick with it. She confesses to an obsession with Beatrix Potter and gets her ideas for creating mice and other animals from the author's characters.

Thanks to Shirley's handiwork, Cobble is now hiding in buildings throughout the complex as the target of a scavenger hunt activity for our youthful visitors. Each felt mouse holds a bright red heart to capture attention.

Also, Cobble the Mouse bookmarks were designed by Shirley, with a very long tail to mark a reader's stopping point. Cobble the Mouse finger puppets and other related items are sold at the Museum's Gift Shop. Cobblestone Society Quilt Show-October 1st



The Cobblestone Society Quilt Show is scheduled for Sunday, October 1st from 12 - 4 pm at the Cobblestone Church. In the past we have featured antique quilts and coverlets. This year we will focus on "newer" works of textile art in quilts and such. The emphasis is on the works of local and regional crafters. We will also display a unique creation by local quilter, Hope Telovsky Stirk, which she affectionately calls the "Jesus Quilt."

The other categories we will present include traditional designs, both hand and machine quilted. There is also a division for the work of younger quilters under 18 years of age. Wall hangings featuring any and all categories are also welcome.

The Proctor Room will be used to display and sell a variety of crafts with an emphasis on textile creations. Akeley Fox Event-September 16th



The Cobblestone Society is pleased to "welcome home" its restored red fox mounted by Carl Akeley. A native of Clarendon, New York, Akeley established himself as one of the most influential taxidermists in the history of the United States. His major works exist in museums throughout the country including the Akeley Hall of African Mammals in the American Museum of Natural History in New York City.

The red fox was mounted by Akeley at the age of 16 and was procured for him by Francis Harling of Albion. The mounted fox diorama represents one of Akeley's earliest works still existing in Orleans County. This amazing diorama was donated to the museum in 1979 by John Seager, great-grandson of Francis Harling, in memory of his parents Agnes Harling Seager and John Seager.

The Museum worked with taxidermist and conservator George Dante of Wildlife Preservations in New Jersey alongside two conservators from the American Museum of Natural History to have the piece fully restored to its original beauty.

A reception with the Clarendon Historical Society will take place at the 1834 Cobblestone Church on Saturday, September 16, 2017 at 5 PM.





COBBLESTONE MUSEUM GHOST WALK

OCTOBER 8, 2017 from 1-5 pm



Join us as we step back in time on Sunday, October 8th for the Cobblestone Museum Ghost Walk and visit several "ghosts" connected to the Cobblestone Museum's past. Tour guides will lead you through a walking tour of 10 different locations on the Museum's campus, including a cobblestone schoolhouse, the oldest cobblestone church in North America, and a cobblestone parsonage, all National Historic Landmarks. Along the way guests will "meet" apparitions of such notables as newspaper editor Horace Greeley, who once owned the Cobblestone Parsonage; railroad sleeping car inventor George Pullman, who attended the Cobblestone Church; and Grace Bedell, who encouraged President Lincoln to grow his iconic beard. Over twenty such reincarnations are planned to make the visit truly remarkable.



Visitors will also learn about the history of cobblestone structures and view many of the Museum's collections. Event organizer Sue Starkweather Miller said, "This is my 9th year of ghost tours and this one is all new. We're looking for

two dozen playful 'souls' to fill the 'spirited' roles and a good handful of energetic tour guides to lead guests through about a dozen planned sightings." The Cobblestone Museum Ghost Tour is included in the NYS Haunted History Trail for 2017.

Tours begin every half hour beginning at 1pm and will last about 90 minutes. The final tour will set out from the lower level of the Cobblestone Church at 4pm. The event will be held drizzle or shine, so be prepared. A half mile of walking is required so comfortable shoes are a must. The tour also includes several steps, so it is not fully accessible. The cost for the Ghost Walk is \$10 for adults and \$7 for Cobblestone Society Members. Kids 12 and under are \$5 and those under 2 are free. Pre-registration guarantees a spot on one of 7 tours departing on the half-hour. Registration can be made in person, by phone at 589-9013, or online at cobblestonemuseum.org. Walk-ins on October 8 will be accommodated in any open slots remaining.


