Cobblestone Society to Hold First Annual Membership Dinner-April 25

#### "The Cobbles of Elmira" by Richard Palmer



For many years, the house at 120 W. Washington St. in the village of Bath, Steuben County was claimed to be the southernmost cobblestone building in the state. Then, people in Hornell did some research that led to the claim that the magnificent Italianate/ cobblestone house at 89 Hill Street was a bit further south than the one in Bath.

Neither is correct. The southernmost cobblestone house in New York State seems to be the Judge Hiram Gray house at 15 East Cobbles Street just outside the city limits of Elmira. It was known in its heyday as "The Cobbles." It's less than six miles from the Pennsylvania border. It was built between 1838 and 1840 by Judge Hiram Gray and is the only known cobblestone house in Chemung County. The five year restoration project was done by Michael Devlin of Elmira who resides there with his family.

The water-rounded cobblestones for the house are said to have been gathered from gravel beds on neighboring farm lands. They are of various colors and sizes. The cobblestones were matched in size as close as possible using a board with holes cut in it which was also a custom. The house was built the traditional way, the corner quoins being squared gray limestone blocks.

# More Church Window Restoration by Jim Bonafini

As part of The Cobblestone Museum's preservation efforts, we continue to stabilize our buildings for future generations to enjoy. This is made possible by your donations and a grant from the Rochester Area Community Foundation. One such project is the restoration of the Cobblestone Church windows.

Many sills (16) have deteriorated to the point of needing replacement. Over the summer, new white oak sills were cut at a local lumber mill and are air drying to prevent cracking. The first one was installed in November (see photos below) and the project will be completed in the spring.

## Four Sunday Painters Art Classes with Patricia Greene to be Offered This Year



The "Sunday Painters' Classes" will be a series of four hands -on art workshops taught by representational artist, Patricia Greene of Medina. Pat, a

lifelong art enthusiast, is an art graduate of Buffalo State College and a 2009 GO ART! recipient. The workshops will be held at the Cobblestone Museum on Sunday March 4, April 8, May 6, and June 3, all 1-5pm. The classes are designed to build sequential continuity as students move through the workshops, but students can join at any point in the journey or pick and choose as they see fit.

The genre for the lessons will include: Color Theory (Color Harmony using a limited pallet of four colors), Composition (Finding the focal point-"The Star of the Show," Creating

Drama (Using darks/lights, soft/sharp, warm/cool), and Learning from the Masters (Studying and copying styles from historical notables).

Each student will complete a painting to take home at the end of each lesson. Class size is limited so enroll early at cobblestonemuseum.org or call (585) 589-9013. The cost for Cobblestone Society members is \$45 and non-members will pay \$50. Canvas board, brushes, oil paints, odorless spirits and carry-home box will be provided. An art show of student art with free public admission will be mounted at the museum throughout 2018.
