### THE MOST FOR THE LEAST

What is more touching to the senses than music? Some things never change. In fact, there is very little which is really new. On Tuesday evening, April 10, 1979 at 8:00 P.M. the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra will perform in the Albion Middle School and not unlike a group of "Refined and Up-to-Date" musicians of eighty years ago as pictured above. Stockschlaeder's Musical Entertainers Programme was performed at the Albion Village Hall for the low price of 10 & 15 cents which suggests that people in Orleans County have always gotten the most for the least when it comes to professional entertainment. Since its inception in 1974 the Orleans County Council on the Arts has strived to do just this for people of Orleans through the finest performers.

At the turn of the Century many a fair-sized village had a theater or Opera House where traveling musicals, minstrels, vaudeville or dramatic productions were held. Medina had its Bent Opera House, Albion had its Pratt Theater and Concert Hall while Holley also had an Opera House. The list of professional traveling performers through the years is practically endless with some notable names to boot. They include Marie Dressler, Buffalo Bill Cody, Rubintoff and his violin and now to that list we can add the internationally renowned David Zinman, music director and conductor of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra.
