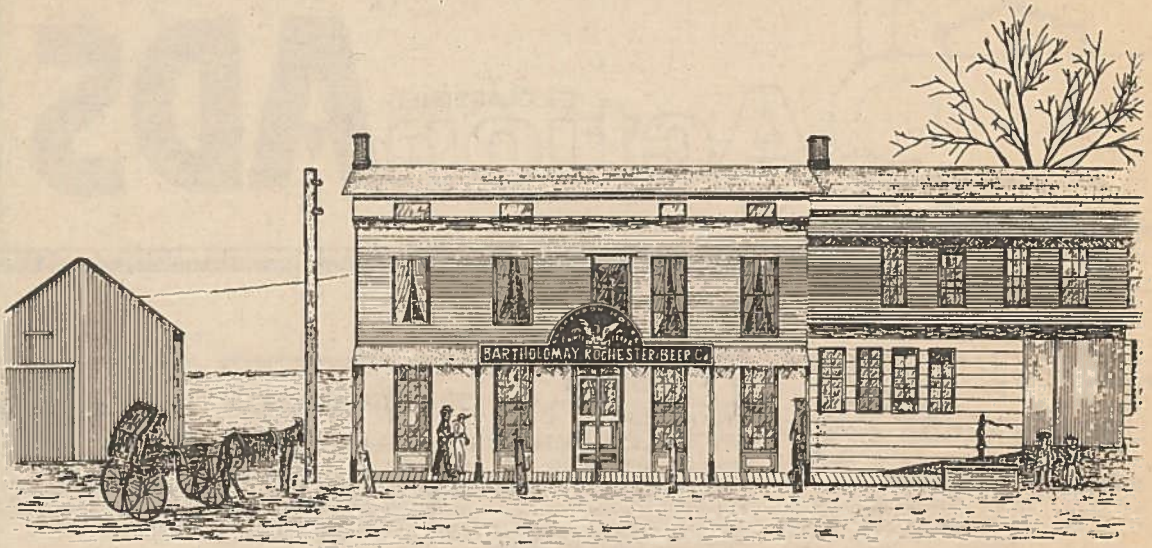

Scenes of Old Clarendon *12-15-88* No. 50

This Christmas season the Clarendon Historical Society has a unique and artistic gift item for sale. It is a series of three prints showing scenes of Clarendon taken from old photos circa 1900. These have been made into drawings by Gary Knight of Clarkson. The three scenes represent the west side of the Holley-Byron Road in the hamlet of Clarendon. The first drawing takes in the old mill, Clarendon falls, a couple of residences and the Ralph Bowen Blacksmith Shop. The second print includes the Clarendon Hotel which is depicted above; the third view looks upon the hill at the intersection, showing the "flatiron building," old school, former Universalist Church and the Stone Store. This set of three prints on a fine heavy grade tan-colored paper sells for \$15. Contact Alan Isselhard, Clarendon Historian, for purchasing at 638-6994.

Only 250 sets were made in this rather limited edition. This project, which was undertaken by the Clarendon Historical Society, was funded for \$375 through the Decentralization Program Administration by the Orleans County Council on the Arts. The program is made available through OCCA to non-profit organizations who wish to produce an artist's product whether it be musical, theatrical, art, etc. Next season through a similar award, the Clarendon Historical Society plans to have Gary Knight make three more views of Clarendon showing the east side of the Holley-Byron Road in Clarendon.
