Between now and next spring fifteen new histormarkers will be placed around Orleans County. his project using Community Pride project noney, was initiated through the Orleans County ourism Board. Carlton Town Historian Lysbeth loffman suggested last year that each municipal istorian in the county select an historic site in their espective town or village where such a marker ould be placed. The total of fifteen is because of an towns, four villages and the county each of which has an historian. The markers paid for by an Irban Development Corporation grant, will serve tell tourists and home folks alike of our local eritage.

They are made of heavy aluminum cast by the Valton-East Branch Foundry in Walton, N.Y. All re painted the state color blue and trimmed with right yellow letters. Each one shows a N.Y. State ago and carries the credit slogan "Orleans County"
