LUMINARIES IN THE FIRMAMENT

Luminaries In The Firmament (Gen 1:15) or A uide To Stained Glass Windows In Orleans ounty, a publication to be released this fall by the obblestone Society is progressing along on chedule. Dr. James Orr has completed most of e picture taking with both color and black and hite photos for the book. Over twenty churches th exceptional figural windows will be repreented. To do justice to the subjects, such a volnn must have color prints. The book will basically be in two parts. The first ouping will consist of windows with action which it a story. These will be arranged in chronological der according to the life of Jesus. The second art will also contain religious subjects including legórical interpretations of Jesus, saints not und in the Bible and etherial imagery.

One such action window that will be included is sown here. It is located in St. Joseph's R.C. hurch in Albion which was dedicated in 1896. It is ased on the following text found in Matt. Chapt. 2 erses 13-15.

...an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a ream and said, "Rise! Take the child and the other and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell ou, for Herod is about to search for the child in reder to murder Him." So he got up at night, took e child and His mother and departed into Egypt here he remained until Herod's death, so that the ord's word through the prophet became fullfilled. Out of Egypt I called my Son."

I think it's interesting that according to an ascure legend, Mary laid the tired Jesus down to sep between the paws of the Great Sphinx on eir trip to Egypt.

This window therefore, is entitled The Flight Into gypt. The left lancet depicts Joseph with a staff alking beside a donkey which is carrying both ary and Jesus as shown in the right lancet. Mary wearing red and blue denoting love and truth spectively, while Jesus is dressed in white sugesting purity and light. We note in this illustration e rather atypical halos over both Joseph and ary which appear to be rings rather than the ore traditional circles of light. And while Jesus buld normally be embossed with a separate halo



to denote Mis sacred nature, no halo specifically appears for Him. We can only deduce that Mary and Jesus are thus sharing the same halo.

In the base of the window it states: "In Memory of Daniel McCarthy." The 1887-88 Orleans County Directory lists a Daniel McCarthy in Barre. With no other information available on him at this time I can only assume he may have been a local farmer.
