Local legend notes that in 1882 when this buildstreet we can see a sign stating: "H.B. Doolittle ing was under construction, Mr. Swan kept track of Dentist". This was Horace Doolittle whose practice the time laborers wasted on the project. This was by the turn of the century was known as H.B. time spent lighting their pipes, tying their shoes, Doolittle and Son when George P. Doolittle joined standing around talking, quitting early, taking with his father in dentistry.

As to the buildings shown here, the one to the finished Mr. Swan added together all the wasted left (stone) now houses the Family Hardware with time. He then figured his workers had wasted
