"Their store, located at 430 Main St., is neatly and conveniently arranged, is fitted up with a view to conducting the business to the best advantage, the front part being devoted to the display of the stock carried, which includes all kinds of choice confectionery, from the finest chocolates to the plainer goods, all the popular brands of cigars and

tobaccos, smokers' articles, foreign and domestic fruits, and a general line of everything pertaining to the business in hand.

"The rear part of the store is fitted up as a lunch room, oysters in all styles, tea, coffee, cocoa sandwiches of all kinds, pies and pastry 1907 to 1909 to 101 not not period being served at all hours from early morning to late? at night, everything being strictly fresh, Heat and clean, and served in the most appetizing manner and at popular prices. Delicious ice cream and soda water, made from pure fruit flavors, are also served in season, ice cream being sold by the plate, pint, quart or gallon.
