## Seventh-Day Adventist Church — Jeddo

This picture taken around 100 years ago shows the Seventh-Day Adventist Church at Jeddo. The congregation was organized in 1871 with 28 members and conducted a school for its member's children in a nearby barn for several years.

In 1886 the congregation incorporated and purchased a lot at the northeast corner of Route 104 and the County Line Road. The church building was erected the same year with the community giving generously to the building fund. As a result it was seen as a community church with other denominations occasionally

using it for services.

The Seventh-Day Adventists never had a resident pastor and relied on Elders to conduct services.

By 1911, the congregation had become too small to care for the property and it was purchased by a neighborhood organization as a community center. Later this organization died out and it was used as an auction house and more recently as a collectibles shop.

Fire did extensive damage to the high pitched roof a number of years ago which has been replaced with a new roof system.
