However on a more series note if is often hard

For example, if your father had a brother he would be your uncle. If your uncle had a son he would be your first cousin. If your first cousin had a son he would be your first cousin once-removed. Your son and your first cousin three-times removed would be you second cousins once-removed. If you had a grandson he would be a fourth cousin to your first cousin three times removed.

Once you start figuring this all out it's sometimes surprising who and how many you are related to. Yes indeed, "... much married..."
