## Fruit Judging

he following interesting article is taken from an Albion High School yearbook. The Cheveron back in the teens and twenties was published twice a year. The information gleaned here is from the "Christmas Number" of 1916.

"The First Western

"The First Western
New York Fruit Judging
Contest was held at the
Albion High School in
the agricultural room on
November 3, 1916. The
Vocational schools of
Agriculture at Holley,
Albion, Middleport
and Spencerport High
Schools were scheduled
to enter the contest but
the Agricultural Department at Spencerport
could not compete on
account of other work.

"Three pupils who are taking third year work were selected by each school of agriculture to represent that school. Sullivan Howard, Donald Howard and Myron Taylor represented

Holley. Edwin Trolley, Milton Kast and Curtis Parker represented Albion. We are unable to give the names of the Middleport school team.

"The work was divided into three parts; 1st, identifying 100 plates of apples, 2nd, identifying 15 plates of pears, and 3rd, scoring 5 plates of apples. On the basis of 100 % Holley had a team average of 79%, Albion had a team average of 63% and Middleport had a team of 55%. Donald Howard and Sullivan Howard of Holley tied for individual high score at 80.5%. Curtis Parker was third at 77%.

"Thirty-six varieties of apples were used for the identification of the 100 plates of apples, ten leading varieties of pears were used for the identification of the fifteen plates of pears; the varieties of apples used in the scoring were Baldwin, Rhode Island, Northern Spy, Roxbury, Russet and Tompkins King with one substitution on each plate.

## Bethinking of Olde Orleans

"The Orleans County
Fruit Growers Association gave a cup valued at \$10 for the competition.
A medal was given by the teachers of agriculture to the pupil making the highest individual score.
The school winning the cup keeps it for one year. To retain the cup permanently, a school must win it three times.
