## An early county jail



ith work currently taking place on the roof of the Orleans County jail, it seems of interest to look back at a former jail structure. The one pictured here from a photo taken in 1899 shows the county jail next to the courthouse.

This Medina Sandstone structure was built in 1838 with a sheriff's residence in front facing East State Street and jail cells in the rear. The wooden addition or wing to the right within a few feet of the courthouse was the sheriff's office, a later addition.

In 1902 the State Commissioner of prisons pronounced the old jail unsanitary and not in compliance with the law. In 1903 this jail was demolished and replaced with a sandstone jail which opened for prisoners in 1904.
