1. Throughout the years, activities at the 4-H Junior Fair have been wide and varied, appealing to various interests and ages. The number one photo shown here, taken in 1967 depicts the participants in the Orleans County Dress Revue. From left to right is Darlene Snyder of Albion, winner of the dress revue with Carol Harling and Barbara Mathes who were runner-ups. A total of 130 girls participated in this event at the Junior Fair eighteen years ago.

2. This year at the Fair through the combined efforts of the Cobblestone Museum and the Orleans County Historical Association, a barber shop exhibit will be on display in the log cabin. Photo number two shows the exterior of Hudson's barber shop in the first decade of this century. It was located at 12 East Bank Street in Albion. Shown in the picture are George G. and Edward Huggson with Herbert M. Hudson. Note the beautiful fully turned barber pole at the curb in the foreground.
